



A “REBORN” POLITICIAN?



A “reborn” politician – what the hell is that? And “reborn” from what into what else?

The normal accepted definition of a “politician” is one who represents the special interests of other parties. Usually those parties are the voters who elected a politician but not all politicians are elected to office nor do all politicians represent their constituents.
